



Staying at the Beehive Cabin? Plan ahead.

Bring some paper goods with you.

- A package of TP, a paper towel roll, to help keep the cabin stocked.
- Towels and linens help keep the laundry down.
- Hand towels, bath towels, washcloth, kitchen dish towels.

We have two double beds and lots of twin spots.

- Bring sheets, pillows and/or sleeping bags.
- There are some bedding and blankets in the cabin.

Bring a big trash bag down with you so you can carry your trash out with you.

- The big trash can by the front door works great, but it needs to leave with you.
- You can bury the compost in the front corner by the lake if you want.
- Please clean up after any pets. There are shovels in the garage.
- The key to the garage lock is hung on the wall next to the door, behind the wood cook stove.

When you arrive, turn on the water. The master valve is under the front corner kitchen window.

- Turn the water off when you leave. Bring the benches in off the porch. Be sure the boats are all put away and the garage is locked.



- The water heater is turned on after you arrive, and turned off when you leave please. It is in the garage, to the right with an ON/OFF sign next to the switch.
- For WINTER, see the other flyer. We drain the hot water heater in October. Do not turn it on empty! First fill it with water before turning on heater coils.



Hopefully you find the cabin clean and tidy upon your arrival.

- Please, no smoking in the cabin.
- It is nice to sweep up and clean up behind you on your way out too.
- Wipe down the bathroom and counters so things will be nice for the next group.

We must all work together to share the resources the Beehive Cabin provides.

- Enjoy the wood, and leave some ready for the next person too.
- The wood stove can be used but only very carefully. Only the front fire box opens now, and the damper does work. Craig repaired it in 2012.

We try to keep track of the things in the cabin. Please don't take things home that belong to the cabin.

- If you break things, let me know, and if things need to be fixed, please do so or let us know.
- We enjoy working together to share what Alma and Leon Shaw had during our childhood.



- Those memories still live here and this old cabin is sacred ground.
- Please respect it and treat it kindly.
- The lake is our friend, and the boats are our pleasure. Enjoy them but be careful. Use Life jackets and put them away when you leave.
